Welcome

This is our first newsletter providing supporters with updates on the work of Pitton Nature Trust. In this edition there is an update on our two main projects; the creation of a biodiverse area on The Close and establishing a Community Orchard on Wiltshire Council land at Roundbarrow Farm.

To date the focus has been establishing the charity and securing initial funding. We are extremely grateful to the Wessex Water Foundation Environmental Fund which awarded us £1,900 of grant funding.

We have now reached the stage where we will be recruiting volunteers to assist us with a range of tasks and seeking donations to fund our activities.

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The Story So Far

Here is a brief timeline of the charity's first year:

March 2023

The trustees established a Charitable Incorporated Organisation (CIO) and an application was made to the Charity Commission to become a registered charity.



April 2023

Pitton Nature Trust became a member of the National Council for Voluntary Organisations (NCVO).

June 2023

Pitton Nature Trust was registered with the Charity Commission (Charity No. 1203375).

The charity opened a bank account with the Co-Operative Bank.

July 2023

Grant funding of £1,900 approved by the Wessex Water Foundation Environmental Fund.

September 2023

The charity submitted a proposal to Pitton & Farley Parish Council for a management agreement to create a biodiverse wildlife area on part of The Close.

The charity submitted a proposal to Pitton & Farley Parish Council and Wiltshire Council for the creation of a Community Orchard on land at Roundbarrow Farm.

December 2023

Management agreement signed with the Parish Council in relation to The Close.

March 2024

Funding received from the WessexWater Environmental Fund.

April 2024

Work started on The Close.

May 2024

Paths cut through The Close to encourage access.



Community Orchard


We are awaiting confirmation from Wiltshire Council on details of the area of land on Roundbarrow Farm which will be transferred to the Parish Council for the creation of a Community Orchard.

Once the land is transferred we will be seeking to reach a long-term management agreement with the Parish Council for the charity to create and manage the orchard for the benefit of the local and wider community for generations to come.

In the meantime we are submitting a funding application to Coronation Heritage Living Orchard fund administered by Wiltshire Council for funding to purchase trees for the Orchard.

The Close

In December 2023 we signed a seven year management agreement with the Parish Council to create a biodiverse wildlife area on part of The Close.





As part of our management plan we sent soil samples to a specialist for advice on what plants were best suited to this area. The experts identified that the area was rich in phosphates and we were advised to strip the grass and a top layer of soil before planting or sowing wildflowers.

Our experiment started with stripping a couple of patches and planting wildflower plug plants; Yellow Rattle, Oxeye Daisies, Field Scabious and Cornflowers, we have our fingers crossed that the plug plants will endure, disperse their seed and come back stronger next year.

We will learn from this experiment whether stripping more grass will enable wildflowers to proliferate and if so, which wildflowers are best suited to the high phosphorus soil conditions. Or if we need adopt a different approach to increase the diversity of flowers to attract pollinators.

Paths are being cut through the area to increase access and in the coming months the local Guides group will be building a "bug house" to attract more insects.
